## Play - chapter two

No matter what your art form, it's important to be joyful and play.
Create a game related to your art form. Below are some ideas for each genre.

- Literary: Cut at least a dozen people (characters) out of a magazine. (Be sure that these people are NOT famous.) Then, cut a piece of paper into 6 pieces. Label each one with a genre, for example, romance, action, tragedy, comedy, detective, western, historical.
Next, choose 2 characters and then choose a genre.
Set a timer for 20 minutes, and write their story.
- Visual: Draw with your eyes closed, or upside down.
- Fiber: Go to your fiber stash and pick the ugliest pattern, texture of yard, or item to upcycle. Sketch out a card to make from these items.
- Environmental: Close your eyes and imagine your space with futuristic décor. Play with the time period and see how technology has changed.
- Performing: You're scheduled to perform at Carnegie Hall. Divide a piece of paper into six sections. On 3, write a positive outcome, for example, a movie contract based on your one person show. On 3, write a negative outcome. Out of money. Roll the di. See what happens.
- Industrial: Play with a different material. Your player must create a project in a material different than their usual.
- Culinary: Pick a favorite cookbook. Roll a pair of dice. You roll a 5 and a 2. Flip to the page with the highest number first (page 52). Make that recipe.
